### **Showing 2 Videos focused on Prayer**

(My own words, used as examples, are in italics)

# 1) Introduction

Hi there, welcome to this morning's assembly where we will be looking at 2 videos that are focused on the subject of prayer.

- **a.** Go onto explain in generals terms what each of the two videos will be focusing on, concerning prayer.
- **b.** You could explain the way the videos are formatted, a group of Christian students talking about prayer, interspersed with these same people asking young adults on the street, about their experiences of prayer.
- **c.** Then give a short chat about prayer where you could personalise the theme of the first video. For example the first video is looking at people's first experience of prayer, or simply, whether people have ever prayed.

#### Personal example model:

Before the age of 27 I had never really prayed personally, on purpose about anything. Then after a very subjective encounter with God, and becoming a Christian, I found I had someone to pray to, and from the very beginning I knew, for me, prayer was talking to God, sharing with Him what was on my heart.

**d.** Then you could give a general short explanation of what Prayer is and tie it to the first video.



#### Personal example model:

For Christians praying to God is generally done by praying to Jesus, or in the name of Jesus, we believe that Jesus connects us to the heart of God, as He is the Son of God.

Obviously people in other religions pray differently; prayer is basically talking to God or someone higher, outside yourself.

In the first video you will notice that the people that the guys talk to on the streets are certainly not all believers, and also see prayer in different ways. Most people have heard of prayer, a few people were talking about meditation, or asking, whoever was out there whether they could win the lottery for example. The overall sense was that prayer was a good thing but there was no sense that it had to be done in a fixed way.

#### **Personal Example Model:**

The first time I was ever prayed for, was actually before I was a Christian.

I was in hospital having just had a kidney transplant and the implanted kidney was rejecting.


Unbeknown to me, all the way in Canada, my Auntie, who was the only believer in the whole family, had actually set up a prayer group just for me and my healing.
