Introduction

- · We are going to watch two videos. Both to help us think about prayer.
- What are some types of prayer? petition, thanksgiving, adoration, confession and intercession

What to expect...

- · We will have four opportunities to pause and discuss.
- · Get into groups of 2 or more.
- You will hear from a group of Christians from different denominations discussing their prayer lives and from people on the street being interviewed about prayer.

Story

Share a story of your first time praying:	

For example, 'My earliest memory of a prayer to God was during the war in Iraq. It was a prayer of petition and intercession for God to keep people safe and the war to come to an end.'

Example in Scripture

In The Bible we read in **Matthew 26:36-46** Jesus is in a place called the Garden of Gethsemane with His disciples before He is going to put to death on the cross. Jesus goes away to pray and we read a really honest, intimate and real moment where Jesus is saying to God I know I'm going to suffer. Jesus refers to His suffering as a cup.

Matthew 26:39 says he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will." It's a bit like Jesus is saying I am scared but I trust your ways more than my own.

Do British Students Ever Pray?

Topic: Why We Pray

• Get comfortable and be listening for things you may want to bring up in discussion.

Pause Point 1 - 0:48

Topic: Praying for other people

Pause Point 1 - 2:09

Pause Point 2 - 3:05

How does their reaction make you feel about praying for your friends or family?



Share about you praying for a friend to come to church:

For example, 'I prayed that my best friend would grow in curiosity about the Christian faith and church and want to come and hear the gospel. She came to church and there was a word of knowledge that she related to it. She was so touched and experienced God's spirit through that word of knowledge.'

Scripture

"Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." Galatians 6:2

Prayer

God, help us to remember that we can care for the people we have in our lives through lifting them up in prayer. We choose to trust you like Jesus trusted you in the garden before He went to the cross. God when we speak to you, you listen and we thank you for the closeness we have with you through prayer. We ask that our friends who do not know you yet would know that same closeness. We ask our friends we accept you as their friend, father and saviour.
