THY KINGDOM COME 2022 ANNUAL REPORT

Introduction

This year marks the seventh annual Thy Kingdom Come prayer movement. Initiated by a call from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to the Church of England to pray for evangelisation, Thy Kingdom Come has blossomed into a global ecumenical movement uniting more than a million Christians in nearly 90% of countries worldwide, across more than 85 different denominations and traditions.

From Burundi to Brazil, South Africa to Sri Lanka, Australia to Austria and beyond, Thy Kingdom Come continues to grow with an increased depth of engagement from national agencies and senior faith leaders to the production of different language versions of print and digital resources in many nations.

As ever, a strong commitment to ecumenism is at the heart of Thy Kingdom Come. This was reflected in the participation of churches from different denominations and traditions ranging from Roman Catholic to Pentecostal, Baptist to Reformed, Methodist to Anglican, at national and local levels.

Collaboration is also central to Thy Kingdom Come, as we continue to work with various parachurch organisations such as 24-7 Prayer, LICC, Hope Together, Transform Work UK and others.

Thy Kingdom Come remains committed to being accessible to all, irrespective of denomination, age group, geographical location, or ability. As a result, we have created a suite of resources for all ages, from 3-103, which also includes videos in sign language, print resources in braille, and resources adapted for children with additional needs.

'My cousin, who isn't a Christian, has been one of my "pray for 5" for the last 5 years. This Pentecost Sunday, he came to church of his own volition! Totally uninvited, he just decided to go and is now interested in beginning his own journey of faith. For those in the UK and much of the Commonwealth, Pentecost Sunday coincided with celebrations for Her Majesty The Queen's Platinum Jubilee – providing a wonderful missional opportunity for many churches to reach their local community with the Gospel and share their faith.

COVID-19 has impacted congregations, leaving many weary and in need of refreshing. Similarly, we wanted to encourage those who have yet to see the fulfilment of their prayers, such as loved ones, come to faith in Christ after many years of prayer. This is why we introduced a new content strand 'Persevering in Prayer' in the lead up to and after the 11 days, comprising a series of audio testimonies, Bible verses, and quotes to encourage persistence in prayer. In many countries COVID-19 has changed the shape and ministry of the Church, presenting new opportunities for mission online and in social media.

Every year, we are astonished at how God moves. Our survey findings show that many people have repeatedly participated in Thy Kingdom Come over the years, drawing them closer to God, deepening their prayer life and encouraging them to share their faith with others. This year we have received a significant number of testimonies about people giving their lives to Christ.

What was the impact?

The impact of Thy Kingdom Come extends beyond praying for loved ones to come to faith. For many people, Thy Kingdom Come is a time of refreshing: a season to draw closer to God; to strengthen their prayer life (corporate and individual); to deepen discipleship at home and church; and an encouragement to evangelise and witness – sharing their everyday faith. For many, it is also a time of real unity, a sense of being part of a global family; and, in local contexts, a real opportunity to work ecumenically.

SURVEY HIGHLIGHTS (BASED ON 1000 RESPONDENTS)

80% 80% of people who took part this year had participated in previous years. 90% were praying for family and friends to 90% come to faith as the main focus - similar to previous years. 75% who took part this year are planning on **75**% following up with or talking to the people they were praying for - exactly the same as 2021. 70% of those who used the digital resources **70**% rated them as excellent and nearly 30% as good. 99% of those who took part this year are 99% planning to take part again next year - same as for the past few years!

Digital media reach

Thy Kingdom Come's digital content engages audiences across the world with all videos produced over the last seven years amassing millions of views.

The award-winning TKC app, available in seven different languages, continues to grow in popularity, being downloaded in 45 countries this year alone. There are plans to update the app in future to modernise and improve functionality.

According to the feedback survey, the most popular digital resources are the daily emails (including all content), daily Bible readings and reflections, and videos.



Participation

How did churches and families take part and what resources were on offer?

As ever, churches, families and individuals took part in Thy Kingdom Come in a variety of ways. For many, as a result of the pandemic, a hybrid approach was employed – with some taking the opportunity to gather in-person (the first time since COVID-19) in significant numbers, to others preferring to engage in a digital space.

Activities ranged from hosting continuous prayer sessions (both on and off-line), to in-person Pentecost and Jubilee celebrations; from organising prayer stations in the church or church grounds, to prayer-walking with the local community; from setting up Cheeky Pandas prayer trails for children, or crocheting crosses and distributing them to neighbours with little prayers, to 'prayer drives', where small groups drove and prayed for the needs of their local area.

Whilst many prayed for loved ones to come to faith in Jesus, others used Thy Kingdom Come to pray for wider issues such as social issues, current affairs etc.

'Our people, who were sitting with the prayer stations when church was open, were very prayerful and God touched them when no one was there. One was so aware of God that they shared on Facebook. We anointed two of our congregation. Children were very open to the teaching at the Jubilee event.'

Riverside Vineyard

Riverside Vineyard Church held two Bow Down events, in Staines, Middlesex and Feltham, London bringing many together to kneel together in prayer for local communities and for nations as part of Thy Kingdom Come.

Trent Vineyard also held a Bow Down event this year, gathering many to pray in the town centre for the city of Nottingham.

Vineyard Churches UK have participated in this time of prayer for several years with churches hosting a multitude of Bow Down events across the UK and Ireland.


Pentecost Sunday / Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

To commemorate and celebrate HM The Queen's 70 years of faithful service, many churches hosted Platinum Jubilee celebrations on Pentecost Sunday. This included:

- Jubilee Street parties / outdoor celebrations held by churches opportunity to share faith with neighbours
- Schools ordered free copies of the Cheeky Pandas books to give as Jubilee gifts for children

This year, to highlight this unusual timing, the final video for Pentecost Sunday was a tribute from Archbishop Justin Welby to Her Majesty The Queen, reflecting on her strong Christian faith as the foundation for 70 years of faithful public service.

INTERNATIONAL / GLOBAL UNITY

Light Up the World in Prayer

We know that there are lots of TKC activities happening worldwide which you may not always know about. Here is a snapshot.



In Brazil, Thy Kingdom Come was shared in the House of Bishops to stimulate support, leading to several dioceses (including Rio De Janeiro, Recife, Sao Paolo, Amazon and Sul Ocidental) taking part. Resources (Prayer Journal-2021 and Novena-2022) were translated into Portuguese and daily video and written reflections were shared on social media throughout the 11 days. There were also a number of in-person meetings in local parishes. The impact of this was not only a renewed energy in prayer, but a raised consciousness about the importance of praying for others as a core part of discipleship. It was also noted how therapeutic taking part was, especially during the challenge of COVID-19.

This was spearheaded by Bishop of South-Western Brazil, Francisco De Assis Da Silva, who said: '*Every year, more and more people are involved in this beautiful movement: beautiful because it is a movement of prayer.*'





Several churches in the USA participated in Thy Kingdom Come including churches such as Christ Episcopal Church, Wyoming which hosted two Beacon events – 'Stations of Light' on 31st May and a 'Pentecost Eucharist and Red-Kite-Fly' day on Pentecost Sunday.



St Paul's Church, Manitoba Canada were involved in Thy Kingdom Come – sharing the prayer movement with other Christians and making some of the resources, such as the Prayer Journals, available to members of their parish and others. They distributed Novena booklets and Prayer Journals to members of their parish. In the words of one of the church leaders: 'We are not a large parish, but we pray. We look forward to prayer together across the world, for others to find Christ.'



The Episcopal Church in the Philippines celebrated Thy Kingdom Come in several ways:

'This year there was a concerted effort to raise awareness of Thy Kingdom Come within schools and churches in the Philippines. This included the creation of a local version of the TKC Facebook page using some of the key resources created and local content, which will be used to encourage prayer all year round. The TKC app was also promoted. There are plans to increase participation in Thy Kingdom Come next year.'

South West Awake

Thousands of Christians formed a chain of prayer and praise on the South West Coast Path of England, uniting many from different traditions across the region supported by the Diocese of Exeter.





Churches across different denominations and traditions participated, including the Methodist Church of Great Britain, as well as hosting a number of ecumenical gatherings. Various dioceses within the Church of England were also involved such as the Diocese of Southwark, the Diocese of Carlisle, the Diocese of Sheffield. For example, The Diocese of Southwark ordered hundreds of this year's Prayer Journals for local prisons to use alongside organising prayer stations.

There has been strong participation from churches in New Zealand over the past few years including the translation of key resources into Maori and hosting of events and activities for example in the Diocese of Wellington.

The Netherlands

'Thy Kingdom Come has been a helpful tool and a welcome impulse to use our prayers between Ascension and Pentecost as intercessions for those who do not know Jesus as their Lord and Saviour. For many years we have encouraged believers to join this movement. Over the last three years, we have translated your Prayer Journal for some local churches in the Netherlands, for Dutch-speaking Christians to join the movement.

This year 2022, we are working with other missional organisations to present a Dutch translation of Thy Kingdom Come in the Netherlands and have started conversations with Alpha Netherlands and 24-7 Prayer to expand Thy Kingdom Come nationally this year and beyond.'

Japan

We have had wonderful support from all the Bishops in Japan, encouraged by Bishop Augustine of Kobe and The Revd Paul Tolhurst who is Secretary of their Department of Mission while being Mission to Seafarers Chaplain in Kobe.

Mothers Union

For several years, Mothers Union have held annual Thy Kingdom Come Beacon events (in-person and online), bringing together different voices from across the world, from Rwanda to Wales, Madagascar to Guyana and beyond.

This year's annual online global moment included contributions from Worldwide President of Mothers' Union, Sheran Harper and Central Chaplain, Bishop Emma Ineson amongst many others.

Mothers' Union is one of the world's first women-led organisations, which today, comprises hundreds of individual Mothers' Union charities across 84 countries.

France

On Pentecost Sunday, All Saints Marseille held a special service entitled *Que ton règne vienne!* (Thy Kingdom Come) devised by a group of Christian denominations in Marseille working together (Anglican, Roman Catholic, Orthodox, United Protestant, Baptist, and free evangelical), inspired by the Anglican Church's 'Thy Kingdom Come' initiative. The coordinator of the event was a member of the *Chemin Neuf* community in Marseille.

The service took the form of a series of meditations, one on each line of the Lord's Prayer, with a particular focus on 'Thy Kingdom Come' and in the context of the Marseille ecumenical community's continuing prayers for peace in Ukraine. The location was the *Eglise St Ferréol* in Marseille, at the centre of the city in the *Vieux Port*. The service was later broadcast on the local Christian radio station, RCF.



North Macedonia

For the last few years, we have posted braille versions of the Prayer Journal and Novena to several Christians in North Macedonia.



For the last few years, Thy Kingdom Come has been endorsed by senior church leaders across Scotland who have mobilised their networks to participate in the 11 days of prayer. Endorsements, in the form of short video contributions, this year included the Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, Lord Jim Wallace, Bishop Mark Strange, Primus of the Scotlish Episcopal Church, and Archbishop Leo Cushley, Roman Catholic Archbishop of St Andrews and Edinburgh in Scotland.



For the last few years The Anglican Church in Finland have participated in Thy Kingdom Come including the translation of the website and key resources into Finnish.

Hong Kong

Australia

Churches and dioceses across the nation supported Thy Kingdom Come including the Diocese of Perth.

Malaysia

The Diocese of West Malaysia organised a number of events, bringing together churches across the local area.

Over the 10 days, they organised daily morning services and nightly prayer services.

On the eve of Pentecost they organised two events – a seminar on healing and deliverance and a Healing Rally with more than 100 people in attendance.

CASE STUDY

Praying for the City – Nottingham, England

More than a 1000 people from 100 different churches gathered to worship and pray together for their city – Nottingham.

The event was organised by Nottingham City Prayer (NCP), an ecumenical movement of Christians across the city who regularly commit to prayer to Christ's church united, God's power released and city blessed.

They have organised large city-wide prayer and worship gatherings for Thy Kingdom Come since 2017.

This year's focus was about looking outwards as to what the attendees could 'give away' and take out into their communities.

To keep the prayer momentum going, NCP now gather at 7 am every second Thursday of the month in different church locations across the city, with each one bringing their own unique welcome and worship.

'I always find it so amazing – the unity, the joy that fills the whole place when we praise God together. A foretaste of heaven for me,' said Mother Damian from the Poor Clares (Roman Catholic). 'Every time we hold this event, there seems to be a prophetic moment which captures the essence of the gathering,' said one of the organisers, Mark Hopkins, from the King's Church, Arnold, which is a member of the Ground Level Network. 'This year we had six people on stage leading prayers – each in their own native language. They were praying in Farsi, Spanish, Cantonese, Chichewa, Hausa, and English.'

Revd Lynda Blakeley, St Stephen's, Sneinton (Church of England) agreed: 'Hearing people pray in their own language was deeply moving and a stark reminder that this is God's Church, not ours; and that His Church is global and so much bigger than our little patch.'

'When we join together as Christians from different denominations, cultures, and backgrounds, we discover, and also reflect, a more holistic image of God. When we prayed in different languages with one accord at the Thy Kingdom Come prayer meeting, it felt like Pentecost is the Tower of Babel redeemed!' said Rev Yanyan Case (Methodist Minister).



Resources

We produced resources for all ages – 3 to 103 – and they were also available in different languages; some of which were translated in-country, reflecting stronger commitment and ownership of TKC. Resources were available in both digital and print versions, such as the Prayer Journal and Novena – both written by Archbishop Justin Welby.

Children and families

This year we collaborated with the Cheeky Pandas once again to produce a cartoon TV series and a suite of resources for children aged 3-11, designed to combine young children's love of high energy songs, quality animation, and engaging characters with biblical content. Cheeky Pandas engages children at a critical age for faith formation. We produced a range of Bible-based resources including a brand new cartoon series based on the Fruit of the Spirit, new songs, activity packs, and assembly plans. Our special Platinum Jubilee resources included a special cartoon episode and free story book that was distributed through schools and churches across the UK. BSL and Widget versions of our cartoons and activity packs made them among the few Christian resources to be accessible to children and parents with additional needs.

We built new partnerships to extend the ministry's reach, partnering with 'Raise Up Faith' to provide Sunday School resources, and Wonderborn Studios, an award-winning mainstream TV production company of children's content. Live praise parties featuring giant panda costumes took place at the UK's major Christian festivals including Spring Harvest and Big Church Day Out. The resources have been used in schools, churches and homes to nurture children's faith in the UK and beyond – with increased engagement in different parts of the world.



'I gave out the free Cheeky Pandas books to the local parent and toddler group, children at church, neighbours' children on our road, and also my young grandchildren. They are amazing! The children immediately started reading and looking at the pictures as soon as they grabbed hold of them!'

Youth

This year we teamed up with leading UK Youth ministry, The Way and the Church of England to produce a selection of videos made by young people for young people on praying for others, sharing their faith, and their personal testimonies on prayer. The videos were well-received, amassing hundreds of thousands of views online and being used as resources for growing faith at home and in church youth work contexts.

'I so appreciated having some resources to use with my teenage daughter – the app with the video content was fantastic.'



Adults

This year's Prayer journal and Novena were written by Archbishop Justin Welby. Beautiful artwork for the Novena was used in different ways to inspire prayer. Eleven new videos were produced from different denominations and traditions including Archbishop Justin Welby, Methodist Youth president Daud Irfan, paralympian Stef Reid MBE, three new CofE Bishops, Monks of Mirfield Community of the Resurrection, Archbishop Angaelos, and the James Family. These resources provided insights into different traditions and denominations and also interesting personal stories, highlighting broader issues such as faith and family life, persecuted church etc, as well as different prayer traditions such as silent prayer.









'I was inspired by the prayer journal in particular to write my own prayers, a collection of which I used in leading the intercessions in church on Pentecost Sunday. The reflections were thought-provoking.'

Accessible Resources

All the videos were available in BSL and the Prayer Journal was available in braille, made possible by the Torch Trust. Widget versions of the Cheeky Pandas activity packs were also created for children with additional needs.

Our heart's desire is to continue our range of accessible resources so that all people are able to fully participate in TKC in a way that is suitable for them, so there are no barriers to participation.

Resources in different languages

The Novena written by Archbishop Justin Welby was also available as short video reflections and was translated into several different languages – French, Spanish, Portuguese, Kiswahili, Japanese, Finnish, Arabic, Welsh, Bangla, and Korean.

For the first time this year, the Prayer Journal, also written by Archbishop Justin, was translated into Dutch.

The TKC app and website were also available in a similar selection of languages.

Collaboration is at the heart of Thy Kingdom Come working not only with churches but also parachurch organisations to create resources and to encourage prayer across different networks throughout the 11 days.

We have worked with global 24-7 Prayer movement, since the inception, and in the last few years partnered with them on the brilliant Lectio 365 App – providing daily audio reflections which this year included contributions from Archbishop Justin Welby and the Upper Room- online virtual 24/7 prayer inspired by the book of Acts – created in response to the Pandemic.

Thy Kingdom Come in the workplace - collaboration with Transform Work UK

For the last 2 years, Transform Work have taken part in Thy Kingdom Come, providing resources to help Christians to pray together during the 11 days such as a prayer diary and prayer ideas for your workplace.

This year, they organised live daily prayer calls from across workplace sectors from Education to Healthcare, Arts to Law, Government to Media along with pre-recorded audio prayers from different sector representatives.

The daily meetings brought together hundreds of Christians from different denominations and traditions across the UK in prayer for God's Kingdom to come in each of these sectors - for Christians to be courageous in sharing their faith, and to bring about truth and righteous ways of working.

Mal Shaw, Trustee and Director at Transform Work UK reflects: "One of the key aspects for me personally is the way that praying together for our work brings together people from different denominations in unity, including Anglican, Baptist, Methodist, Pentecostal, Catholic, Orthodox. This was one of the last prayers of Jesus before He went to the cross and it has been great to see this in action as we have worked with Thy Kingdom Come."

Media Collaboration:

We have worked with a number of Christian TV and radio broadcasters to extend the reach of Thy Kingdom Come, airing the video and audio content to millions worldwide including GOD TV and TBN UK.

CAP

Christians Against Poverty:

Over the course of Lent, Christians Against Poverty (CAP) created a space for their employees to worship and pray specifically into seeing more people come to Jesus, using the resources provided by the Thy Kingdom Come website. This was primarily done through creating an online hub for staff to visit during their working day, enabling them to use the content in their team time and individually throughout the week.

'Thy Kingdom Come was so helpful for us as a charity to not just lift up the people we serve at CAP, but to pray for and remember those who are closest to us, interceding for them to come to know Jesus.'

Defence Christian Network:

For the past three years, the Defence Christian Network (DCN)- has supported the Armed Forces' Chaplaincies with an Ascension Day service, followed by daily prayers leading up to Pentecost including videos from the Novena and additional content written by military personnel.

This year, Armed Forces' Chaplains, military personnel and MOD civil servants joined in the 11 days of prayer in homes, barracks and operational bases around the world.



Biblica

"As a global, ecumenical initiative, TKC is equally accessible to all our members, regardless of denomination or culture," said the DCN's Chair, Lt Col Simon Maggs. "Defence Christians come from a wide range of denominations, plus a significant percentage have ethnic minority heritage, so TKC provides a great opportunity for us to pray together. It's a model that works well for us as Christians serving in Defence, as our frequent postings mean we can't be choosy about where or with whom we fellowship!"

Biblica:

This year's Novena was produced with support from Biblica- International Bible Society. It was translated into several languages including Arabic, Bangla (Bangladesh), Finnish (Finland) and Welsh (Wales). The artwork featured beautiful lino prints created by artist Anna Heslop.



Pray for 5

This continues to be an enduring message that resonates beyond denominational differences and across international borders.

'One of the people I prayed for in the past two years during #ThyKingdomCome began to ask me to pray for her and for her family members. Just recently she told me she has begun to pray herself! This has amazed and thrilled me. I am thankful that TKC gave me the incentive, and the courage to begin praying for others who do not pray or consider themselves religious. I will continue to do so!'

'It's easy to be overloaded with so many people to pray for. This resource helped me to focus my prayers on just five individuals who are yet to know Jesus or who have a distorted view of who he is. I didn't have to feel guilty that I wasn't praying for absolutely everyone I know in that position.' 'My godson A, one of the five I prayed for during TKC, has just committed his life to the Lord! Things are not too easy in his life, so please pray for him.'

'Over the past five years I've been praying for my husband, two of our sons, a cousin, and niece to come back into a relationship with the Lord. My eldest son has been working in a bar for the past four years while deciding what he wants as a career: he started university last September to become an RE teacher. He's been asking questions and talking about faith and last week he sent an email to his work to say that he can work fulltime until university begins again but not on a Sunday as he will be going to church. This is so massive: when I told my dad he did that fist pump and "YES". God is so good!'

'Two of my five who never talk about religion ended up sitting in the sun together talking about God and heaven, and now one of them has really been talking about heaven and "being saved". I nearly dropped when I heard them talk!' 'The power of the Holy Spirit truly moved in two of the very troubled five I felt led to pray for, bringing a protective strength, stillness, and peace. This year's resources brought both comfort and reassurance.'

For many churches, Pray for 5 was a stimulus to encourage people to pray but was also going to be used and adapted beyond the 11 days – with many churches committed to praying for five as a regular part of church life.

'We are a rural Presbyterian church in N Ireland. We organised a special Pray for 5 Sunday service. We encouraged our people (of all ages) to keep on praying for their five beyond TKC. And one of the ways we will do this, will be by having occasional two-minute slots in our Sunday service.'

'We were definitely hearing from God that we are to be salt and light within our families, friendship groups, and communities. To be different. Next time I lead a service I will be focusing on #ThyKingdomCome and how praying for five doesn't stop after the event.'


Uniting the Global Church
